## MAJOR LEWIS "AL" ELAM USAF RETIRED 1934-2007

The Lake Worth High family has lost a dear friend and loyal supporter with the death of Al Elam, class of 1952. Al passed away in Good Samaritan Hospital in West Palm Beach on October 31, 2007 from leukemia.

Al spent twenty-two years in The Air Force after which he and Ann returned to their roots in Palm Springs. Al was an avid golfer and enjoyed gardening but, after family, his first love was commitment to his alma mater, Lake Worth High School. When plans were being made to form a Lake Worth High School Alumni Foundation, I consulted with Dennis Dorsey, '53. He suggested that I contact Al Elam who had also voiced a desire to form an alumni foundation. Al and I then traveled to Richmond, IN to attend a workshop on "How to do it." During the following months Al, Dennis and I worked together to make the dream a reality.

No one has contributed more of himself to The Alumni Foundation than Al. He served as the second president and volunteered for every committee the board of directors approved. He gave tours of the school to class reunions, served as our "Webmaster" to establish the web sites for both The Alumni Foundation and Dollars for Scholars Scholarship Foundation and ordered and maintained inventory of alumni merchandise. When The Alumni Foundation established the "Pave The Way" engraved brick program for scholarships, Al took on a personal responsibility to get every member of the class of '52 to purchase a brick with their names on it. His class now has 60 bricks installed in front of Tommy Hansen Hall. If Al knew that a classmate could not afford the \$100 for a brick, he would pay for it himself. He also purchased bricks for classmates who had passed away early in life and had been virtually forgotten by others. Al took great pride in assisting classmate Charlie Brooks in the planning of the annual "Kissimmee Shootout," a reunion of Lake Worth grads at Charlie's hotel in Kissimmee. At his death, Al was our representative in working with the publisher of our next edition of The Lake Worth High School Alumni Directory. He also was working with the Dollars for Scholars golf tournament committee, giving his time and money to help insure a successful tournament. It will take several people to fill Al's shoes.

Al is survived by his wife of 51 years, Ann; children, Allyn (Ron) Elam-Mask; and Bert (Barbara) Elam; grandson, Noah Benjamin Elam-Mask; and a host of family and friends, many of whom live around the world.

At the family's request, a scholarship endowment has been established in Al's name. Contributions should be made to LWHS Alumni Foundation with the notation "Elam Scholarship". Contributions should be mailed to LWHS Alumni Foundation, 1701 Lake Worth Road, Lake Worth, FL 33460.

Al must have been born with a need to help others. During the time he was a captain in the Air Force, he was known as "Captain Al, the Airman's Pal."

2006 President’s Award -- Tom Lamar

Tom Lamar is the unsung hero in the creation of the International Swimming Hall of Fame and in helping to shape the young lives of the boys and girls who he taught and coached in swimming. Least we forget, here is Tom’s story.

He was born on June 20, 1917 in Meriwether County, Georgia and attended school in Hebbardville, a small mill town with a typical commissary operation. His fond childhood memories were Daddy taking him to the Okefenokee Swamp in the family motorcar for fishing, seeing huge alligators and tramping through the swamp. Other memories included KKK demonstrations, parades, cross burnings, church and Sunday school. He was a great sports enthusiast playing baseball, football and basketball with a little swimming.

Tom’s father, worked for the Seaboard Railroad and the family lived in various places in Florida from Starke to Lake Worth, where he graduated from high school. He played Class D baseball in Alabama, worked at a bank in Jacksonville and held a job at United Fruit in New Orleans. After returning to Lake Worth, he became the beach Head Lifeguard, coached the high school swim team, volunteered for US Coast Guard duty and served as the Lake Worth recreation director. All the while, he knew

that a college education was necessary to keep improving. So it was on to the University of Miami in 1946, graduating Cum Laude in 16 months and



coaching the school’s first legitimate swimming team which went undefeated.

He then coached at Fort Lauderdale High School for six years before moving to Pine Crest School as coach. While in Fort Lauderdale, Tom went into public administration as

Assistant to the City Manager. In this role, he helped pass the bond issue, which provided the funds to dredge the Intercoastal Waterway and Bahia Mar to fill in the seawall, which is now the site of the International Swimming Hall of Fame. The site became State property and State granted the rights allowing

the Hall of Fame to be built and the City to build a swimming facility. Tom traveled to the 1962 AAU Convention in Detroit to lobby for Fort Lauderdale to

winningest high school coach in the nation. Only his pupil, Jack Nelson, has more with 30 wins. At Lake Worth High School, his boys won State Championships in 1945 and 1947 and the girls in 1946. Eight years at Fort Lauderdale High School (1948-1955) saw both boys and girls championship, each of the years. At Pine Crest School, the girls won six successive years (1956-1961) and the boys won in 1957, ‘58 and ‘59. He had another Championship at Winter Park. As the first great Florida High School Swimming coach, Tom won State Championships at four different schools. He also coached the Winter Park YMCA, which placed second in 1972 at the swimming pool he helped establish- the Hall of Fame Pool.

After two years coaching at the University of Miami, Lamar was selected as the US Women’s Swimming Team Coach for the 1955 Pan American Games. Two of his swimmers, Carolyn Greene and Cynthia Gill competed on the team. Other swimmers included 1956 Olympian Jack Nelson, who succeeded Tom at Pine Crest School and Phil Drake, butterfly NACC National Champion.

become the selected city to host the Swimming Hall of Fame.

Tom then moved to Winter Park, Florida, where he taught junior high school and coached the Winter Park High School Swim Team. It was during this time that he received US State Department offer to travel to Iran as an advisor to their Athletic Association, instructing their swim coaches. He returned to Winter Park and retired a few years later in 1973, turning the program over to his assistant, Skip Foster, who continued to produce winning teams.

With 29 State Champion Teams, Tom is the second

Our Lake Worth High School football team has had a tremendous season. We were looking to finishing the regular season with a record of 7-3 and 3-1 in the district. On Monday, November 5<sup>th</sup> we qualified for

the playoffs by beating Royal Palm Beach 17-7 in a one quarter tiebreaker. We then played Park Vista for the district championship.

On Friday, November 16<sup>th</sup> we traveled to Vero Beach for a first round playoff match. It was a hard fought game. However, though our team was greatly improved since they beat us in the second game of the season, Vero came out ahead and won the game 24 to 21.

Our team has many seniors this year who have lettered for two and three years on varsity. Our quarterback, Star Jackson, has been nominated for the Lou Groza award for the most outstanding player in Palm Beach County. He will be attending the University of Alabama in the fall on a football scholarship. Lineman Joe Looney has also been recognized as one of the county’s top performers and will be attending Wake Forest University on a football scholarship. Running backs Doug Perry

and Roosevelt Watson were among the leaders in rushing in the county and are being coveted by several schools. Our head coach Errick



Lowe (who was a Lake Worth High football standout) has been nominated for the county Coach of the Year. Our coaching staff took a raw group of freshman three years ago and developed them into one of the best teams Lake Worth has ever had.

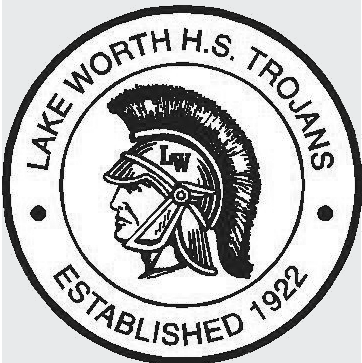

With \$313,000 in endowments and a total of \$352,450 in scholarships awarded to needy students since our founding year, 1999, we are proving our ability to raise and manage funds. The establishment of The Donnelly and Elam Endowments are further proof that we are serious about what we are doing and can be trusted to “take care of business.”

Board members Helen ‘50 and Harold ‘47 Gilmore recently completed writing a Wachovia Bank grant which, if fully funded, will add \$10,000 to our coffers. 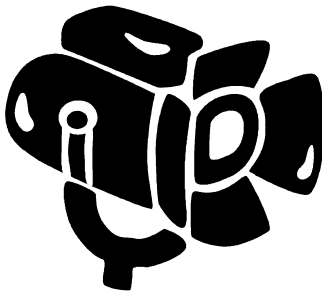

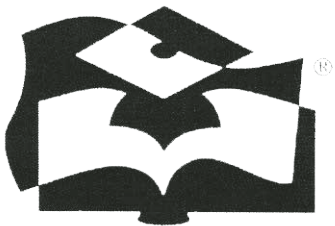
