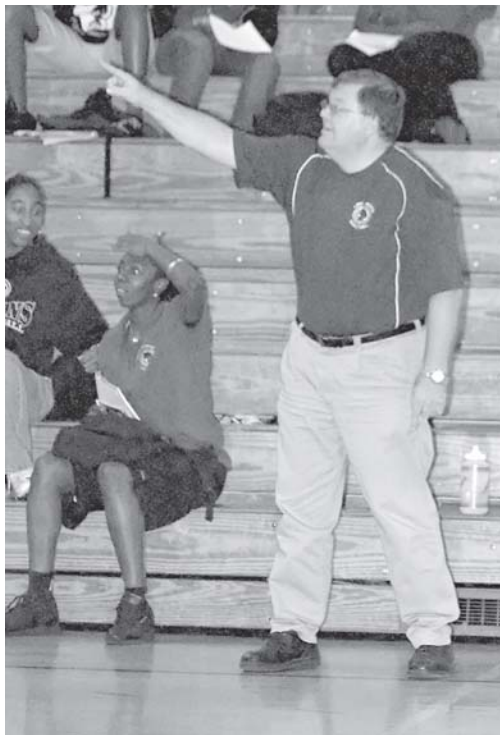

I came to Lake Worth High School from Indiana in August of 1982. I was hired by Mr Cantley to be the boys basketball coach. After that I was the men's basketball coach of Palm Beach Atlantic for four years followed by four years as the assistant coach at Palm Beach Community College. In the spring of 1996 Jack Marcum, the Athletic Director, asked me to coach the girls basketball team. I told him to look for someone else over the summer but if he didn't find someone I would do it. We went swimming, rode horses, went out in the boat. There were four of us girls, Eileen, Joyce Maloney, Patty Helm and myself. We all went home, took showers and got into Patty’s car again and went to the drive-in Theater. All went to sleep. The next day we all had to go to work and here we were all sunburned. That’s the time we all wore the starch net under our skirts, all that net scratching our legs. We also couldn’t sit down from riding the horses. I was all so much fun and really funny.

Dena Dorsey McCracken, Class of 1974. Attending LWHS from 1971-1973 left nothing but great memories and great friendships, still enjoying to this day. I have to say that I couldn’t even imagine going to any other local school and enjoying it as much. I was always a treat to start off our school day with a trip to “Grandma’s Bakery”. She had the best bakery ever. Many of us would start our day off there and then even get to school EARLY to “hang out” on the patio out front before the bell rang. At lunch we would all get in our cars or our friend’s cars and race to “Pizza Palace” on north Dixie Hwy. Space was limited so it was always a mad dash down the “Avenue”. There was always a meeting place after games and meets but my favorites were our gatherings on Melaleuca Lane and LW Beach. Wouldn’t change a thing, even if I had a “do over”.

Claudia Hicks Bass, Class of 1953, married to the late Vic Bass, Class of 1953. Just one memory from LWHS, that is hard to do. The teachers stick in my mind and I think they were great. We use to go to the “Sugar Bowl” on the corner of A Street and Lucerne Avenue, for lunch and later when we could drive, we went to the golf course and let Vic’s mom spoil us. I spent most of my time chasing after Vic Bass, in a very subtle way of course. When I would get interested in someone else he would break us up and then leave me and go back to Sandra Deisch and then start all over again. I spent time with the band, so I wouldn’t have to take PE, and on the golf course, where I could chase Vic. And WHO could forget the Turtle races at the beach viewed from parked cars?Need more??? And she finally caught Vic....

One day before Homecoming game, Judy Letho Caldwell, editor of the Hi Times, the school paper, coach Cook and Lester Kimberly came up to me and congratulated me on being one of those selected as Homecoming Queen. As they were finishing up Coach Carlisle came up and said “NO, she didn’t win, she tried with Virginia Summerville so we flipped a coin and Virginia won”. Needless to say, all were surprised. I didn’t have time to be elated however and I pacified myself with remembering I was the band singer and had to sing at the half-time of the game anyway...so on the night of the game at half-time, after the band had played their introduction, I went out to sing my number”Sing me the Song of the Islands”, I will never forget , and left the field. It was then that I was told they had forgotten to turn the mike on, and no one heard it....

Dory Dorsey Sacco, Class of 1979 I attended LW Jr Hi and LWHS and some of my favorite memories stem from the many band trips taken as a member of the Flags marching with the band. I also met my boyfriend, now husband, Tony Sacco, who also attended LWHS. There were many fun times and good friends.

Ira Alexander, Class of 1934. Some of the memories that come to me when I started as a freshman at LWHS in 1930, the parking lot had cars owned by the Principal and teachers. No students could afford their own cars, one exception was Patricia, Norman and Teen Kennedy, their father brought them to school and picked them up in a Big Graham-Paige Sedan. The next thing that comes to mind is when the temperatures were in the 50’s...No School. Now the football field was below the parking lot and the hill was terraced, spectators had to sit on the ground. On the day before the game with another high school, volunteers, us kids, would pull, hoe and remove the sand spurs from the playing field. Quite a change from the then to now.

Before I finish I want to say we had the best of the best, from the principal, L Hamblin, teachers, Emily Stevens (Spanish), Martha Mc Cune (Math), ER Goodell (English & Coach), Mrs Price (History). My favorites there were Peg Leg Landis (Crafts), Miss Lemon (can’t remember what she taught) and if I left someone out I am sorry. My father opened City Plumbing Co on south J St in 1923 and I started 4th grade at what is now the City Hall Annex. My teacher was Mrs Baker. Lots of Large Rubber Banyan trees there. Then on North Grade through the six grade, 7th and 8th at LW Jr High, as it was a new addition to the High School in 1927. As I now look back at those days, I can truly say those were the happiest times of my entire life. I turned 92 March 22nd. Thanks to LWHS..Amen and Thank You.

My Life as a University
President’s Wife
Winnie Clowe Class of ‘45

I graduated from LWHS, PBJs, and FSU, then taught Spanish and English at Pahokee for two years. Paul Pearson, LWHS Class of ‘44, and I married when he began his PHD studies at U of F. I worked the three years during that time as an Administrative Assistant to a VP at U of F. We lived in Tulsa, Oklahoma, for a year (where our first son was born) then had a twenty-six year tenure at Rutgers University in New Jersey.

In 1981 Paul accepted the position as President of Miami University, in Oxford, Ohio and he held that position for twelve years until retirement. I became the “spouse of a University President”---a “first lady”! We lived on campus in a lovely old home built in 1839. I had household help and used catering services for most of the entertainment we did in the home. We did a great deal of entertainment! In fact, the major rewards of being a University President and the spouse are the people we have met thru the years. We hosted students (there are 15,000 at Miami U) facility staff, alumni, polititians, government employees, business people, educators, entertainers, community people--a wide variety. We traveled extensively to meet alumni and others---across the US, throughout Europe (Miami U has a campus in Luxenberg) the Greek Isles, the Orient (Japan, China, Korea) Havana, Australia, New Zealand, Mexico, even a trip to the Galapogos Islands and a safari in Kenya.

Everywhere we went we met MU Alumni. We hosted US President George Bush, Gerald Ford, Alumni CEO of large corporations, Procter & Gamble, DuPont, UPS, AT&T, alumni like one who struggled financially to attend MU and at the end of a successful career gave \$10 million to the University. We interacted on campus with speakers and entertainers -- Colin Powell, Rudy Grieliens, Queen Noor, Bob Woodward, Robin Roberts, Gloria Steinman, Bill Crosby, Red Shelton, George Burns, Bob Hope, and just recently I chatted with Sandra Day O’Conner. And a highlight that is memborable was dinner at the White House when Ronald & Nancy Reagen hosted a State Dinner.

Beside being very busy on campus and elsewhere. I did a Inot of community volunteer work. I was on the Board and served as President of the first Hospice which we brought to the area (a very rewarding contribution). I also served on the Boards of Planned Parenthood, different retirement communities, the county children’s services, Performing Arts, Community Foundation and I still volunteer at our local hospital.

We built a home in Oxford when Paul retired. He died in 2000. A university community is a wonderful place for retirement to keep active in sports, lectures, arts, music, theater. So I still have a very busy life. My children and eight grandchildren live in Dayton, Lexington and Atlanta so I am very happy and busy with great friends and family in my retirement years.

Kathryn lives in Hypoluxo and is married to Paul B Gundlach, Class of 1965. They have three children: Paul W., Kathleen and Nichol.

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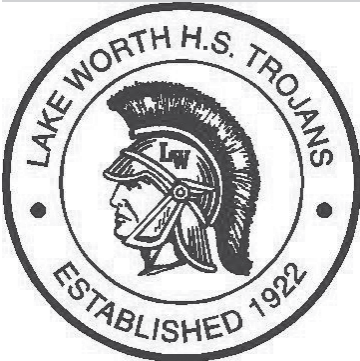

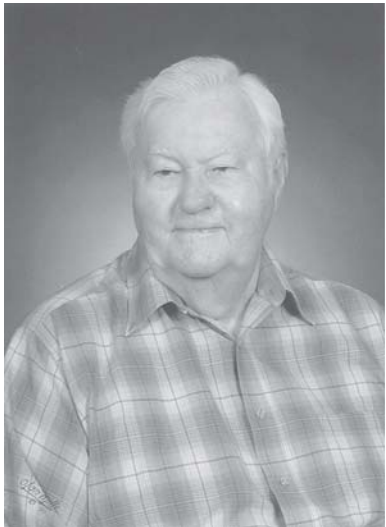

Roy Michael Class of 1935



Lake Worth High School was the beginning of a lifetime interest and involvement in community leadership and education for Roy Michael, class of 1935. He was the president of his junior and senior classes and was the recipient of the Balfour Award given for academic excellence. This same award was presented a year later to Martha Belle Tatom, Roy's high school sweetheart who became his wife in 1940. They have four children, Jennifer Shifflett, Anna Louise Greene (Balfour Award recipient in 1962), Bill Michael and Jim Michael. Roy is a proud grandfather to 17 grandchildren and 21 great grandchildren.

After graduation from the University of Florida, Roy taught industrial arts classes at Pahokee High School until he was called to active duty in the army in April, 1942. He served as an artillery instructor until the end of World War II achieving the rank of Captain. In the spring of 1946, after leaving service, he was promoted to Major in the reserves.

Roy served as a Lake Worth City Commissioner from 1949-1953, and as Palm Beach County Commissioner from 1953-1961. He also served as a school trustee until his election to the County Commission. In 1965 Roy returned to the Palm Beach County School system as a teacher at Seacrest High School. Seacrest later became Atlantic High School. After competing a Master's program in school administration at FAU he served as a Dean and later an Assistant Principal at Atlantic. He retired in 1980.

Roy and Martha enjoyed splitting their time between Lake Worth and Black Mountain, North Carolina. After her death in 1983, Roy became a full time resident of Black Mountain. He continued to be active in community activities in the Black Mountain United Methodist Church and the Lion's Club. He also served as a volunteer at the Chamber of Commerce for several years.

COL Allan R. Wetzel, USA, (Ret.)

It is with great regret and sorrow that I must notify you of the death of LWHS alumni, Allan Wetzel, on May 9, 2006 in Crossville, TN. Allan was buried at Arlington National Cemetery on June 5, 2006.

Allan was born in Green Bay, WI on August 19, 1938. His family moved to Lake Worth, FL, where he graduated from Lake Worth High School in 1956. Allan met and fell in love with June Everett in his Senior Year and they were married in June 1961 upon Allan's graduation from West Point. They have tree children and six grandchildren and have resided in Crossville, TN since 1999.

Allan joined the Army Reserve on March 5, 1956, and entered active duty in June 1956. He applied for and received a competitive appointment to the United States Military Academy (West Point). He entered West Point as part of the Class of 1961 in July 1957, graduating as a Second Lieutenant in June 1961. Allan received in addition to his BS in Engineering from USMA, a MA from the University of Central Michigan. His military education includes the Command and General Staff College and the Army War College. Initially commissioned in Armor, he later branch transferred to Infantry in 1969. He retired in November 1990 after twenty-nine plus years of commissioned service and thirty-four plus years of total service.

During his period of Active Duty, Allan served in numerous units in command and staff assignments throughout stateside and oversea assignments. He also served as a Tactical Officer at West Point as well as a Company Officer at the United States Naval Academy. In addition, he served seven years in Germany and two combat tours in Vietnam. His last duty assignment was at Fort Sam Houston, San Antonio, TX. One of the highlights of his numerous assignments was as Company Commander of Alpha Company, 2nd Battalion (Mechanized), 22nd Infantry Regiment during 1967-1968 in Vietnam.

During his military career Allan was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross, Silver Star, Legion of Merit, Bronze for Valor with two Oak Leaf Clusters, Meritorious Service Medal with two Oak Leaf Clusters, Purple Heart with three Oak Leaf Clusters, Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry with Gold Star, Vietnamese Honor Medal, the Combat Infantryman Badge and a Presidential Unit Citation.

Allan was a member of the First United Methodist Church. He enjoyed bicycling, gardening and loved to read, especially books of military science. Allan was active in community veteran affairs. Prior to the brief illness before his death, he was President of the Upper Cumberland Chapter, Military Officers Association of America. He is also a member of The Disabled American Veterans, American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Legion of Valor; Society of West Point Graduates, and 22nd Infantry Regiment Society. For the last three years he led the fight for local veterans' groups to establish Junior Reserve Officer Training Program (JROTC) for the Cumberland County High School (CCHS). Allan volunteered to serve as the first CCHS JROTC Senior Army Officer Instructor. He will be remembered for helping institute the JROTC program in place at Cumberland County High School.

COL Allan R. Wetzel, U.S.A.

Citation: Distinguished Service Cross

War: Vietnam War

COL ALLAN R. WETZEL, then Captain, Armor, United States Army, Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 2nd Battalion, 14th Infantry, 1st Brigade, 25th Infantry Division. For extraordinary heroism in connection with military operations involving conflict with an armed hostile force in the Republic of Vietnam. Captain Wetzel distinguished himself by exceptionally valorous actions on 16 February 1968 as commanding officer of an infantry unit conducting a mission in the city of Tay Ninh. His company, reinforced by an attached platoon approached a wall near the temple grounds, it suddenly encountered an intense volume of automatic weapons, grenade and rocket fire from a battalion-sized enemy force. Captain Wetzel quickly deployed his men and directed their suppressive fire on the insurgents. He then crawled to the lead element's position and found that it had sustained heavy casualties. It was also in danger of being subjected to a flank attack. Captain Wetzel returned to the main element and led a spoiling attack to the temple wall to prevent the enemy from dividing his company and isolating its elements. His men were driven back by heavy automatic weapons fire and he regrouped them for another assault. As he did so, he observed an enemy soldier preparing to fire a rocket at an American armored personnel carrier. Unable to warn the vehicle's crew from his position, he dashed through the intense hostile fire to the carrier and arrived at the vehicle at the same moment it was struck by the enemy round. Despite the wounds he sustained from the exploding rocket, he immediately evacuated the vehicle's crew members to a position of safety. At the same time, the insurgent forces assaulted his company's position. Moving to a holding position along the wall to his rear, Captain Wetzel and six of his men completely halted the enemy's attack with a deadly barrage of grenade and rifle fire. After reinforcements had arrived, he personally directed the extraction of the wounded. Captain Wetzel's extraordinary heroism and devotion to duty were in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflect great credit upon himself, his unit, and United States Army.

Lake Worth Dollars for Scholars will host the ninth annual awards ceremony May 9th in the LWHS auditorium. DFS Scholarships were first awarded in 1999 in the amount of \$10,000 and reached a peck of \$54,700 in 2005.

This year, we will award a total of \$45,000 which will bring the nine-year total to \$365,900. Many of our recipients enroll at Palm Beach Community College or Florida Atlantic University where their scholarships are matched 100% upon completion of a successful first semester, thereby doubling the value of their scholarship.

We are also administrators of the Barry Grunow Memorial Scholarship Fund. Mr Grunow, a teacher at Lake Worth Middle School, was murdered in his classroom by a student on the last day of school in 2000. Concerned friends and citizens immediately started a drive to establish a scholarship in Barry’s name. The Barry Grunow Memorial Scholarship is available to any student aspiring to become a teacher who graduates from any public, private or parochial school in Palm Beach County. Currently, the Grunow Scholarship Endowment Fund is \$73,396. Interest earned by the endowment is awarded each year.

Scholarship applicants must demonstrate the ability to succeed in college and provide proof of financial need. It is my sincere belief that many students have graduated college or are currently enrolled who could not have realized their dream without this scholarship.

Please consider an annual donation to this very worthwhile cause. DFS is a nonprofit 501c3 organization. We have no paid employees or overhead expenses. The Lake Worth High School Alumni Foundation pays all our bills.
