

This year we have received fewer than 50 applications from a class of almost 500; that is only 10 percent of the eligible students. I hope we are able to change this poor representation and ensure we have numbers that approach those of the past, 150 or more. I realize the school's administration has done its very best to increase this number, only to realize there seems to be a lack of empathy on the students' part.

As the outgoing president, I hope these changes come to fruition – and soon.
