We have had a successful opening of school this year. Over 2,800 students were welcomed to our beautiful campus this year. We encourage you to visit us, if you have not seen the positive renovations that have occurred to our facilities.

Our magnet/choice programs continue to thrive with approximately one third of our student population involved in the Medical Magnet, Criminal Justice Magnet, and the Air Force Junior ROTC Magnet programs. We added the Early Childhood Education Academy to our magnet/choice programs beginning this school year. Students in our Early Childhood Education Academy will work with pre-school children on-site to prepare to become teachers. 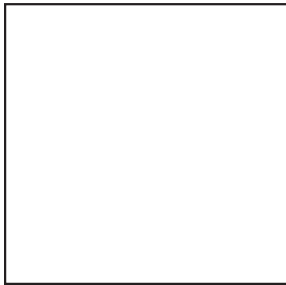

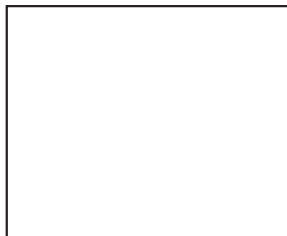

School" a few hours a month . . . think of what we could accomplish.

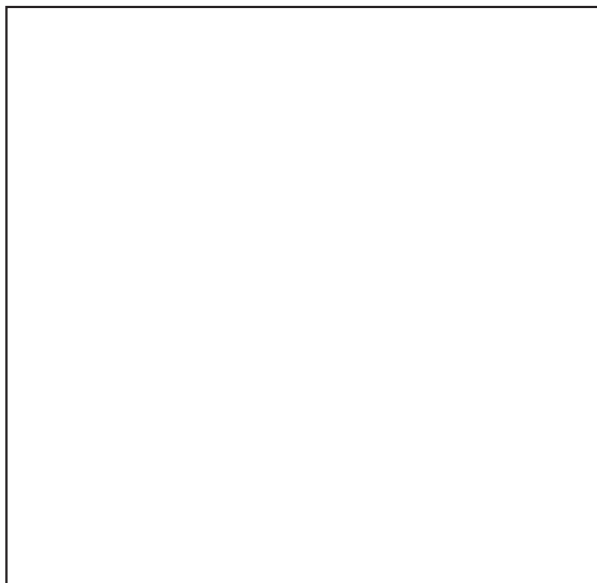

## Charlie Brooks great supporter of LWHS Alumni

Charles Brooks graduated from LWHS in 1952 with Honors. He attended West Grade Elementary located on the corner of A Street and Lake Worth Road for the first through the sixth grades. West Grade was torn down a few years ago. The next three years were spent at LWJHS followed by his Sophomore, Junior and Senior years at LWHS.

Charlie, as he is lovingly called, has two sisters, Betty Brooks Rudd, class of '46, and Loreece Brooks Cabaniss, class of '48. He has one brother, Robert (Bobby) Brooks, class of '54, who is married to Donna Ozinga, class of '53. They all lived off Congress Avenue.

He played football and basketball in junior high and then at LWHS where he lettered in three sports - football, basketball and swimming. On the Trojan Football Team he played the position of Quarterback played football, swam on the swim team and ran track. Following his stint in the army he returned to U of F where he graduated with a BSBA in 1958. He had really wanted to go to Law School but, due to finances at that time, decided to join the Prudential Insurance Real Estate Lending and Appraising Company in Miami and bought an interest in an airplane and learned to fly.

He joined the Commander Mortgage Company in Jacksonville, Florida and left in 1966 to

open C. E. Brooks Mortgage Company, Inc. In 1971, he built his first motel in Gainesville, Florida. Through the years he has owned 14 hotel properties throughout the Southeast which is why owning and flying his own plane came in handy. Currently, he owns five hotels in Florida - Econo Lodges in Live Oak, Macclenny and Tallahassee; Super 8 in Sanford; and the Comfort Suites Main Gate East in Kissimmee. The Comfort Suites is located adjacent to "Old Town" and was voted the "Most Outstanding Comfort Suites in the Nation" and has won every award attainable from the franchise company since opening - Gold and Platinum.

Charlie told me that in the Hi Times Paper when he was at LWHS he made the Boy of the Month as they always picked the eyes of someone, the nose of someone and that he was picked for his hair...he was laughing as today he has very little of that left.

He married Cynthia (Cindy) Mann from Shreveport, Louisiana and they have three children - Cynthia, Charles Jr. and Jennifer.

Charles Brooks has been a great supporter of the LWHS Alumni as he has invited all LWHS graduates to a mini reunion in his Comfort Suites hotel every May, the weekend after Mother's Day, and has made great contributions to both the Alumni and Dollars for Scholars. After the reunion this year, he founded a Scholarship for former Coach and Teacher, Robert Fulton, Sr. and sincerely hopes that other Alumni will make contributions as well.

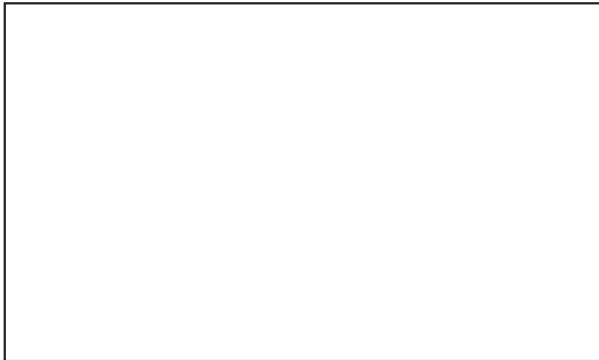
Minerva Waldron was the winner of the 50/50 raffle. A gift certificate

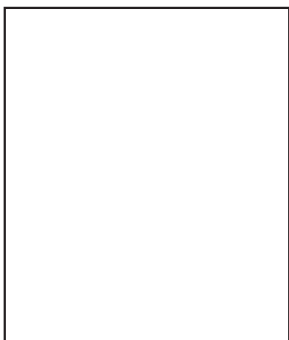
Bessie's first school house, and after graduation, she was employed at City Hall for fourteen years with the Utilities Department.

## Mike Brenan Class of '54

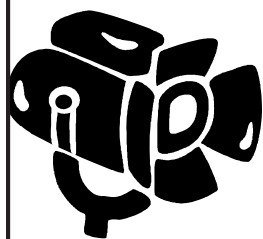
